



Protect yourself, your family, and your community from COVID-19



Get vaccinated and stay up to date. The best protection against COVID-19 is staying up to date on COVID-19 vaccines. That means being fully vaccinated and getting a booster. Fully vaccinated people are much less likely to get sick or spread the virus that causes COVID-19, especially if they have their booster shot.

Get treatment. If you test positive, talk to your doctor right away about treatment options that are available for people who have mild to moderate symptoms. Learn more at mass.gov/CovidTreatments.

A newly launched, free telehealth service can help MA residents more easily access Paxlovid, a COVID-19 treatment pill. Stay home when you are sick. Staying home helps prevent the spread of illness.

Mask up if you need to. Wash your hands often with soap and warm water or use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Learn more at mass.gov/CovidVaccine.

Bats in Your Home?

According to the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH) if there is a possibility that a bat came in contact with people or pets it should be captured for testing. If possible, confine the bat to one room and call the local animal control officer or a private pest control company and the MDPH at 617-983-6800 (available 24 hours) for more information.

The Randolph Fire Department looks forward to seeing the community enjoy many outdoor barbecues this summer. We would like to share some tips to keep everyone safe while grilling.

- Always grill outdoors.
- Make sure that the lid of a gas grill is open when you light it.
- Never leave a burning grill unattended.
- Do not use grills on a porch, balcony or deck with a roof, overhang or wall.
- Space grills away from the house and deck railings.
- For proper disposal of grill ashes, allow the coals or ash to burn out completely and then cool for 48 hours before disposal.
- Keep all matches, lighters and lighter fluid away from children.
- Keep children and pets three feet away from grills.
