Scope/Concept of Project:

In line with the Commission's efforts to preserve and protect Town natural resources and Open Space for recreation, this project solves the current flooding of this section of the Reservoir Walk thereby allowing 12 month, year round passage.

Eliminate soil erosion and sediment deposits into Great Pond at the site. Allow year round access to residents using the Reservoir Walk for recreation.

Success: How will the success of this project be measured?

Success will be measured in two ways: 1. by the elimination of emergency DPW calls for crews and emergency equipment to alleviate flooding and, 2. Year round access for public recreation.

As soon as funding is available and weather permits, the ConComm will meet with DPW management and develop a schedule. It is estimated for 1 week to complete.
